

**THE KENNETH & KRISTI BLIZZARD GALLERY** Through March 2025 — Display Honoring Black History Month — The Arts Council, in cooperation with the City of Kinston, will have on display an eight-panel mural originally installed on the outdoor façade of the Lenoir County Office Building. This mural was created a few years ago as part of a City-wide mural project and commissioned through a grant-supported project through the North Carolina Arts Council, a State agency. The mural depicts the peaceful 1951 Adkin High School walkout by students. In addition to the mural is an exhibit of some selected African American artifacts donated to the Kinston-Lenoir County African American Heritage Commission.

Black History Month Celebration Activities: We "kicked off" the celebration of Black History Month with two (2) incredible performances by internationally North Carolina African American known and Grammy award nominee Pierce Freelon.



Pierce Freelon, a multi-talented artist, educator, and activist is known for his work in music, film, and community leadership. As a rapper, producer, and founder of the hip-hop group *The Beast*, he blends thought-provoking lyrics with creative soundscapes. Beyond his music career, Pierce is passionate about promoting social justice and youth empowerment, using his platform to inspire and uplift underserved communities. He is also the founder of *Blackspace*, an arts and technology collective aimed at empowering young people of color. Through his diverse work, Pierce continues to make a significant impact in both the creative and social realms.

Pierce shared with the students powerful life lessons that he learned from his grandmother. During the event, Pierce spoke about the values she instilled in him, emphasizing the importance of having an attitude for gratitude. He encouraged the students to appreciate the small blessings in life, reminding them that a grateful heart can bring positivity and growth. Through his performance and stories, Pierce not only entertained but also inspired the young audience, leaving them with valuable lessons about resilience, appreciation, and the power of gratitude.

Participating students and faculty were from South Lenoir High School, North Lenoir High School and Kinston High School. In addition, band and music students from several of the Middle Schools were in attendance.

This performance was supported by the NC Arts Council, a State agency, and funded in part by the cARTwheels grant and in partnership with the Community Council for the Arts and the Lenoir County Public Schools.

Also to celebrate Black History Month, selected artifacts from the Kinston-Lenoir County African American Heritage Commission are on display at the Neuse Regional Library, curated by the Arts Council. We encourage everyone to visit both the Arts Center and the library to view works from the collection.



Last month our update concerning our Strategic planning informed you that we were making a pivot in our original plan moving from a full strategic plan for the organization and a coinciding community wide arts plan. Our pivot did not exclude plans for community input therefore we have continued to collect community information so that it can be used to inform our strategic plan. We felt that there was a need for further board development, training and strategic development particularly as it relates to the onboarding of a new director. In recognition of this month's designation as Women's History Month, we would like to focus our spotlight on three women makers who not only have artwork in our Galleria Gift Shop, they also have their studios in our lower-level workspace: Tracey Penrod, Karin Thompson, and Ingrld Quick.

TRACEY PENROD...Tracey Penrod is a professional artist who left her career as a middle school teacher in 2021 for the art studio. Calling Wayne County home, she finds inspiration in the landscapes of Eastern North Carolina, its history, people, and customs. Tracey paints to stir the memory of the viewer and she hopes to convey a message of encouragement whether painting landscapes or subjects from everyday life.

As a part of her creative process, Tracey uses acrylic paint often in combination with collaged paper and dry mediums. Her contemporary paintings are in a style of abstract expressionism and/or semi-realistic while giving a nod to nostalgia. Tracey has exhibited her works of art in galleries, juried shows, and in many other public settings throughout North Carolina. Her work is also



available in the Art Market at the Community Council for the Arts. Having relocated her art studio to the Arts Center in 2022, Tracey can often be found painting downstairs in her studio where she gladly welcomes visitors.





KARIN THOMPSON...Karin's name appeared as one of the clay artists we focused on in last month's Kaleidoscope. However, Karin is a diverse artist and has developed her talents using many different mediums. She is a studio artist who has been active with the Community Arts Council for many years. Her creations have been a constant in the Galleria Gift Shop and her paintings can usually be found throughout the gallery. Karin's work has been in numerous juried shows throughout North Carolina, Artfields 2024, and the NC Artists Show in Raleigh 2024. She currently has a piece in the Atlantic Gallery in New York City. Painting and pottery are her main focus, but she also works in fiber, glass, as well as knits (like her mother Ingrid Quick). Her work always contains a bit of whimsy and inspiration from nature. Animals are one of her favorite subjects and she enjoys working on pet portraits. Please visit her in the studio she and her mother share.

INGRID QUICK...Ingrid Quick is a studio artist who shares a studio space with her daughter, Karin Thompson. Ingrid works in the traditional crafts of knitting and basket weaving. Her great-grandmother taught her to knit when she was about six-years-old. She has seldom been seen without knitting needles and yarn in her hands ever since. At 85-years-old, Ingrid still has projects in the works. Her baskets, hand-knit hats, scarves, and sweaters can be found in the Galleria Gift Shop. She also has work displayed in her studio. Ingrid enjoys making baby blankets, stuffed animal toys, and almost anything else that can be knit as a special gift for a little one.

The Arts Center is privileged to be involved with these talented artists and to provide a showcase for their works. We hope you will join us as we watch







# POTTERY PROGRAVH

Please read if you are interested in participating in a pottery class.

There is limited space in ALL CLASSES with each class limited to 6 participants with a minimum class participation of 4. Registration can be done in person at the Arts Center, on-line (www.communitycouncilfortheartskinston.com), or by calling the Arts Center at (252) 527-2517.

A non-refundable deposit of \$25 is required to be made at the time of registration to secure your space, although the entire amount can still be made at this time, as before. This non-refundable fee of \$25 is part of the total registration fee. Should you need to cancel however, a \$25 processing fee will be non-refundable. This is NEW!! The remainer of the registration fee and the \$25 supply fee is due the first night of class. If you are a returning participant and still have clay stored with us or at home (if you purchased from us) you are not charged a supply fee (\$25) until you require more clay. Registration payments can be made via credit card on line or via phone or in person with credit, debit, check or cash.

IMPORTANT NOTE whether registering online, in person, or on the phone, please register by indicating the first day/date of the class in which you are interested. By doing so, it will help avoid confusion as we accept registration through a variety of means as listed above and at times volunteers are posting your registration. If you have any doubt about your registration, please ask for a staff member or call to verify if using the online process. Our monthly newsletter is always completed by the last week in a month and then sent via bulk mail – there have been times in the past when the post office was tardy in sending the mailing, thus receipt to you has not been on time. When Kaleidoscope is sent to our printer it is automatically posted online, therefore the listing of new classes can generally be found by the end of the week of the current month, or at a minimum the first few days of the next month. If you are unable to find the information you need, do not hesitate to contact the Arts Council at (252) 527-2517, we will be pleased to assist you.




We are now offering "Open Studio" sessions during limited times in the week. This is available to students who have taken classes with us and are familiar with the studio and clean up practices. There will be a monitor present, but no instruction will be offered. There will be three days with times where a student can come in for a three-hour session. The fee for "Open Studio" is \$25.00 per session at the door or purchase a 5-session punch card for \$100.00. Twenty-pound (20#) bags of Little Loafers Clay will continue to be on sale to the community for \$25.00 each. This is the only type of clay that can be used in our studios and must be purchased from the Arts Center. Please ask at the front desk if you are interested in clau.

NOTE: Open Studio sessions include use of the glazes and the kiln. Only those who are working completely at home and bringing in work should pay for the kiln.

The pottery studio will start accepting work made at home to be fired in our kiln. The terms are:

- Clay is Little Loafers ONLY bought from the Arts Center
- Glaze is not included
- Because of limited space, we ask you bring in everything at one time when the kiln is scheduled to be fired.
- Cost of firing for both bisque and glaze is \$25.00 each for a shelf. We also have punch cards you can use for a kiln fire in place of an Open Studio session. When you bring in your greenware, it will go into the next kiln fires as a shelf charge.
- Please pay in advance.
- Glazing, with your glazes, can be done at home or in class or Open Studio, cost not included.
- Glazes need to be Mid-Fire, cone 5-6.
